

HB 2360 -- RELATING TO THE JOINT COMMITTEE ON ADMINISTRATIVE RULES

SPONSOR: Bahr

This bill states that any administrative rule adopted by an agency, board, department, or commission will not be valid if contrary to legislative intent as demonstrated by legislative history.

The Joint Committee on Administrative Rules is authorized to recommend the disapproval of all or a portion of a rule if the rule is not economically efficient based on a cost-benefit analysis or if the rule creates a new classification of an individual or entity resulting in a different outcome for the individual or entity and the enabling statute does not explicitly authorize the classification and outcome as a goal of the rulemaking grant of power.

Rules established by the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations will be subject to committee review and recommendations beginning with the effective date of this bill. Currently, the department is not subject to review.

This bill is the same as HB 964 (2015).
