1 AMEND Senate Bill No. 503, Page 1, Section A, Line 2, by inserting immediately after all of said section
2 and line the following:

4 "160.261. 1. The local board of education of each school district shall clearly establish a written
5 policy of discipline, including the district's determination on the use of corporal punishment and the
6 procedures in which punishment will be applied. A written copy of the district's discipline policy and
7 corporal punishment procedures, if applicable, shall be provided to the pupil and parent or legal guardian of
8 every pupil enrolled in the district at the beginning of each school year and also made available in the office
9 of the superintendent of such district, during normal business hours, for public inspection. All employees of
10 the district shall annually receive instruction related to the specific contents of the policy of discipline and
11 any interpretations necessary to implement the provisions of the policy in the course of their duties, including
12 but not limited to approved methods of dealing with acts of school violence, disciplining students with
13 disabilities and instruction in the necessity and requirements for confidentiality.

14 2. The policy shall require school administrators to report acts of school violence to all teachers at
15 the attendance center and, in addition, to other school district employees with a need to know. For the
16 purposes of this chapter or chapter 167, "need to know" is defined as school personnel who are directly
17 responsible for the student's education or who otherwise interact with the student on a professional basis
18 while acting within the scope of their assigned duties. As used in this section, the phrase "act of school
19 violence" or "violent behavior" means the exertion of physical force by a student with the intent to do serious
20 physical injury as defined in section 556.061 to another person while on school property, including a school
21 bus in service on behalf of the district, or while involved in school activities. The policy shall at a minimum
22 require school administrators to report, as soon as reasonably practical, to the appropriate law enforcement
23 agency any of the following crimes, or any act which if committed by an adult would be one of the following
24 crimes:

- 25 (1) First degree murder under section 565.020;
26 (2) Second degree murder under section 565.021;
27 (3) Kidnapping under section 565.110 as it existed prior to January 1, 2017, or kidnapping in the
28 first degree under section 565.110;
29 (4) First degree assault under section 565.050;

31 (6) Sodomy in the first degree under section 566.060;
32 (7) Burglary in the first degree under section 569.160;
33 (8) Burglary in the second degree under section 569.170;

24 committed on school property, including but not limited to actions on any school bus in service on behalf of
25 the district or while involved in school activities. The policy shall require that any portion of a student's
26 individualized education program that is related to demonstrated or potentially violent behavior shall be
27 provided to any teacher and other school district employees who are directly responsible for the student's
28 education or who otherwise interact with the student on an educational basis while acting within the scope of
29 their assigned duties. The policy shall also contain the consequences of failure to obey standards of conduct
30 set by the local board of education, and the importance of the standards to the maintenance of an atmosphere
31 where orderly learning is possible and encouraged.

32 3. The policy shall provide that any student who is on suspension for any of the offenses listed in
33 subsection 2 of this section or any act of violence or drug-related activity defined by school district policy as
34 a serious violation of school discipline pursuant to subsection 9 of this section shall have as a condition of
35 his or her suspension the requirement that such student is not allowed, while on such suspension, to be
36 within one thousand feet of any school property in the school district where such student attended school or
37 any activity of that district, regardless of whether or not the activity takes place on district property unless:

38 (1) Such student is under the direct supervision of the student's parent, legal guardian, or custodian
39 and the superintendent or the superintendent's designee has authorized the student to be on school property;

40 (2) Such student is under the direct supervision of another adult designated by the student's parent,
41 legal guardian, or custodian, in advance, in writing, to the principal of the school which suspended the
42 student and the superintendent or the superintendent's designee has authorized the student to be on school
43 property;

44 (3) Such student is enrolled in and attending an alternative school that is located within one
45 thousand feet of a public school in the school district where such student attended school; or

46 (4) Such student resides within one thousand feet of any public school in the school district where
47 such student attended school in which case such student may be on the property of his or her residence
48 without direct adult supervision.

49 4. Any student who violates the condition of suspension required pursuant to subsection 3 of this
50 section may be subject to expulsion or further suspension pursuant to the provisions of sections 167.161,
51 167.164, and 167.171. In making this determination consideration shall be given to whether the student
52 poses a threat to the safety of any child or school employee and whether such student's unsupervised
53 presence within one thousand feet of the school is disruptive to the educational process or undermines the

effectiveness of the school's disciplinary policy. Removal of any pupil who is a student with a disability is subject to state and federal procedural rights. This section shall not limit a school district's ability to:

(1) Prohibit all students who are suspended from being on school property or attending an activity while on suspension;

(2) Discipline students for off-campus conduct that negatively affects the educational environment to the extent allowed by law.

5. The policy shall provide for a suspension for a period of not less than one year, or expulsion, for a student who is determined to have brought a weapon to school, including but not limited to the school playground or the school parking lot, brought a weapon on a school bus or brought a weapon to a school activity whether on or off of the school property in violation of district policy, except that:

(1) The superintendent or, in a school district with no high school, the principal of the school which such child attends may modify such suspension on a case-by-case basis; and

(2) This section shall not prevent the school district from providing educational services in an alternative setting to a student suspended under the provisions of this section.

6. For the purpose of this section, the term "weapon" shall mean a firearm as defined under 18 U.S.C. Section 921 and the following items, as defined in section 571.010: a blackjack, a concealable firearm, an explosive weapon, a firearm, a firearm silencer, a gas gun, a knife, knuckles, a machine gun, a projectile weapon, a rifle, a shotgun, a spring gun or a switchblade knife; except that this section shall not be construed to prohibit a school board from adopting a policy to allow a Civil War reenactor to carry a Civil War era weapon on school property for educational purposes so long as the firearm is unloaded. The local board of education shall define weapon in the discipline policy. Such definition shall include the weapons defined in this subsection but may also include other weapons.

7. All school district personnel responsible for the care and supervision of students are authorized to hold every pupil strictly accountable for any disorderly conduct in school or on any property of the school, on any school bus going to or returning from school, during school-sponsored activities, or during intermission or recess periods.

8. Teachers and other authorized district personnel in public schools responsible for the care, supervision, and discipline of schoolchildren, including volunteers selected with reasonable care by the school district, shall not be civilly liable when acting in conformity with the established policies developed by each board, including but not limited to policies of student discipline or when reporting to his or her supervisor or other person as mandated by state law acts of school violence or threatened acts of school violence, within the course and scope of the duties of the teacher, authorized district personnel or volunteer, when such individual is acting in conformity with the established policies developed by the board. Nothing in this section shall be construed to create a new cause of action against such school district, or to relieve the school district from liability for the negligent acts of such persons.

9. Each school board shall define in its discipline policy acts of violence and any other acts that constitute a serious violation of that policy. "Acts of violence" as defined by school boards shall include but not be limited to exertion of physical force by a student with the intent to do serious bodily harm to another person while on school property, including a school bus in service on behalf of the district, or while involved in school activities. School districts shall for each student enrolled in the school district compile and maintain records of any serious violation of the district's discipline policy. Such records shall be made available to teachers and other school district employees with a need to know while acting within the scope of their assigned duties, and shall be provided as required in section 167.020 to any school district in which the student subsequently attempts to enroll.

10. Spanking, when administered by certificated personnel and in the presence of a witness who is an employee of the school district, or the use of reasonable force to protect persons or property, when administered by personnel of a school district in a reasonable manner in accordance with the local board of education's written policy of discipline, is not abuse within the meaning of chapter 210. The provisions of sections 210.110 to 210.165 notwithstanding, the children's division shall not have jurisdiction over or investigate any report of alleged child abuse arising out of or related to the use of reasonable force to protect persons or property when administered by personnel of a school district or any spanking administered in a reasonable manner by any certificated school personnel in the presence of a witness who is an employee of the school district pursuant to a written policy of discipline established by the board of education of the

1 school district, as long as no allegation of sexual misconduct arises from the spanking or use of force.

2 11. If a student reports alleged sexual misconduct on the part of a teacher or other school employee
3 to a person employed in a school facility who is required to report such misconduct to the children's division
4 under section 210.115, such person and the superintendent of the school district shall report the allegation to
5 the children's division as set forth in section 210.115. Reports made to the children's division under this
6 subsection shall be investigated by the division in accordance with the provisions of sections 210.145 to
7 210.153 and shall not be investigated by the school district under subsections 12 to 20 of this section for
8 purposes of determining whether the allegations should or should not be substantiated. The district may
9 investigate the allegations for the purpose of making any decision regarding the employment of the accused
10 employee.

11 12. Upon receipt of any reports of child abuse by the children's division other than reports provided
12 under subsection 11 of this section, pursuant to sections 210.110 to 210.165 which allegedly involve
13 personnel of a school district, the children's division shall notify the superintendent of schools of the district
14 or, if the person named in the alleged incident is the superintendent of schools, the president of the school
15 board of the school district where the alleged incident occurred.

16 13. If, after an initial investigation, the superintendent of schools or the president of the school
17 board finds that the report involves an alleged incident of child abuse other than the administration of a
18 spanking by certificated school personnel or the use of reasonable force to protect persons or property when
19 administered by school personnel pursuant to a written policy of discipline or that the report was made for
20 the sole purpose of harassing a public school employee, the superintendent of schools or the president of the
21 school board shall immediately refer the matter back to the children's division and take no further action. In
22 all matters referred back to the children's division, the division shall treat the report in the same manner as
23 other reports of alleged child abuse received by the division.

24 14. If the report pertains to an alleged incident which arose out of or is related to a spanking
25 administered by certificated personnel or the use of reasonable force to protect persons or property when
26 administered by personnel of a school district pursuant to a written policy of discipline or a report made for
27 the sole purpose of harassing a public school employee, a notification of the reported child abuse shall be
28 sent by the superintendent of schools or the president of the school board to the law enforcement in the
29 county in which the alleged incident occurred.

30 15. The report shall be jointly investigated by the law enforcement officer and the superintendent of
31 schools or, if the subject of the report is the superintendent of schools, by a law enforcement officer and the
32 president of the school board or such president's designee.

33 16. The investigation shall begin no later than forty-eight hours after notification from the children's
34 division is received, and shall consist of, but need not be limited to, interviewing and recording statements of
35 the child and the child's parents or guardian within two working days after the start of the investigation, of
36 the school district personnel allegedly involved in the report, and of any witnesses to the alleged incident.

37 17. The law enforcement officer and the investigating school district personnel shall issue separate
38 reports of their findings and recommendations after the conclusion of the investigation to the school board of
39 the school district within seven days after receiving notice from the children's division.

40 18. The reports shall contain a statement of conclusion as to whether the report of alleged child
41 abuse is substantiated or is unsubstantiated.

42 19. The school board shall consider the separate reports referred to in subsection 17 of this section
43 and shall issue its findings and conclusions and the action to be taken, if any, within seven days after
44 receiving the last of the two reports. The findings and conclusions shall be made in substantially the
45 following form:

46 (1) The report of the alleged child abuse is unsubstantiated. The law enforcement officer and the
47 investigating school board personnel agree that there was not a preponderance of evidence to substantiate that
48 abuse occurred;

49 (2) The report of the alleged child abuse is substantiated. The law enforcement officer and the
50 investigating school district personnel agree that the preponderance of evidence is sufficient to support a
51 finding that the alleged incident of child abuse did occur;

52 (3) The issue involved in the alleged incident of child abuse is unresolved. The law enforcement
53 officer and the investigating school personnel are unable to agree on their findings and conclusions on the

1 alleged incident.

2 20. The findings and conclusions of the school board under subsection 19 of this section shall be
3 sent to the children's division. If the findings and conclusions of the school board are that the report of the
4 alleged child abuse is unsubstantiated, the investigation shall be terminated, the case closed, and no record
5 shall be entered in the children's division central registry. If the findings and conclusions of the school board
6 are that the report of the alleged child abuse is substantiated, the children's division shall report the incident
7 to the prosecuting attorney of the appropriate county along with the findings and conclusions of the school
8 district and shall include the information in the division's central registry. If the findings and conclusions of
9 the school board are that the issue involved in the alleged incident of child abuse is unresolved, the children's
10 division shall report the incident to the prosecuting attorney of the appropriate county along with the findings
11 and conclusions of the school board, however, the incident and the names of the parties allegedly involved
12 shall not be entered into the central registry of the children's division unless and until the alleged child abuse
13 is substantiated by a court of competent jurisdiction.

14 21. Any superintendent of schools, president of a school board or such person's designee or law
15 enforcement officer who knowingly falsifies any report of any matter pursuant to this section or who
16 knowingly withholds any information relative to any investigation or report pursuant to this section is guilty
17 of a class A misdemeanor.

18 22. In order to ensure the safety of all students, should a student be expelled for bringing a weapon
19 to school, violent behavior, or for an act of school violence, that student shall not, for the purposes of the
20 accreditation process of the Missouri school improvement plan, be considered a dropout or be included in the
21 calculation of that district's educational persistence ratio.

45 when a teacher becomes aware that a pupil has committed an act listed in subdivisions (1) to (24) of
46 subsection 2 of section 160.261 on school property, on any school bus in service on behalf of the school
47 district, or while involved in school activities, the teacher shall as soon as reasonably practical report such
48 incident to the principal.

2 have committed an act which, if committed by an adult, would be assault in the third degree as defined in
3 section 565.054 or assault in the fourth degree as defined in section 565.056 shall not be civilly liable for

6 willfully neglects or refuses to perform this duty shall be subject to the penalty established pursuant to
