FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Revenue**, **Department of Transportation** and **State Tax Commission** each assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations.

In response to a previous version, officials from the **City of Columbia**, the **City of Kansas City** and **Callaway County** each assumed the proposal would have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations.

Officials from **St. Louis County** and **Platte County** each assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations.

House Amendment 1

Oversight notes House Amendment 1 removes the misdemeanor charge and fine amounts for damaging roadways, highways or drains. The amendment adds the provision that the overseer of the damaged roadway may notify and request the landowner in violation to repair the damages. If the landowner fails to make the necessary repairs within thirty days, the road overseer or county highway engineer may petition the associate circuit court to get authorization to access the land and make the repairs. If the petition is granted, the court shall include an award for the reasonable costs of repairs, court costs and attorney fees.

Officials from the **Department of Transportation**, **Department of Revenue**, **Office of the State Public Defender**, **Office of Prosecution Services** and **Department of Agriculture** each assume the amendment will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations.
