#### FISCAL ANALYSIS

# **ASSUMPTION**

Officials from the **Department of Public Safety - Office of the Director (DPS)** state they see no fiscal impact due to this legislation.

**Oversight** notes that according to information supplied by the DPS, the maximum amount of funeral expenses that reimbursed through the Crime Victims Compensation Fund is \$5,000. For the past three years, the total payouts from the fund for funeral expenses has been:

Fiscal Year	Funeral Expenses
FY 2013	\$1,014,392
FY 2014	\$758,822
FY 2015	\$961,474

The balance of the Crime Victim's Compensation Fund (0681) at January 31, 2017 was \$9,495,474.

**Oversight** assumes the proposal would not increase the number of claimants to the Crime Victim's Compensation Fund, but rather would allow funeral homes to deal directly with DPS regarding expense reimbursement. Therefore, Oversight assumes the proposal would not have a direct fiscal impact to the fund. A notarized statement is required to be signed by the claimant.
