#### FISCAL ANALYSIS

## **ASSUMPTION**

Officials from the **Office of Administration, Commissioner's Office/Alternatives to Abortion Program** assume that the legislature will continue to appropriate General Revenue to the Alternatives to Abortion program at the FY2016 level, which was \$2,033,561. If this proposal passes, these moneys could no longer be expended and a savings to the General Revenue Fund would result.

**Oversight** notes that section 188.325, which established the Missouri Alternatives to Abortion (A2A) Services Program specifically excludes the provision of family planning services.

Based on discussion with A2A program officials, it is their interpretation that should this proposal pass, the A2A program would not be able to expend the General Revenue money that may be appropriated to it. Many of the providers they contract with are faith-based providers and the program would not be able to require the providers to provide family planning, birth control counseling, abortion care, etc. Therefore, the A2A program would not be able to provide pregnancy-related services as defined by the proposal.

Officials from the **Office of Attorney General** assume any potential costs arising from this proposal can be absorbed with existing resources.

Officials from the **University of Missouri Health Care (UMHC)** have reviewed the proposed legislation and determined that as written it should not create expenses in excess of \$100,000 annually.

**Oversight** assumes the costs incurred by the UMHC related to this proposal can be absorbed within current resource levels.

Officials from the Department of Health and Senior Services, the Department of Insurance, Financial Institutions and Professional Registration, the Department of Social Services, Divisions of: Legal Services, Financial and Administrative Services and MO HealthNet, the Columbia/Boone County Department of Public Health and Human Services and the City of Independence Health Department each assume the proposal would not fiscally impact their respective agencies.

## FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

#### FISCAL DESCRIPTION

This bill requires all organizations that provide pregnancy-related services or counseling to provide medically accurate and unbiased information about birth control, adoption, labor and delivery, and postpartum care. The bill defines pregnancy-related services as services including, but not limited to, family planning, abortion care, prenatal care, labor and delivery, and postpartum care.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
