FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials at the **City of Kansas City** assume that considerable savings could be experienced by this legislation by eliminating the cost of newspaper publishing. The savings will depend upon the number of hearings held during the course of the year, and cannot, therefore, be accurately reported. However, the City holds such hearings several times per month.

Officials at the **Office of Administration** assume no fiscal impact from this proposal.

Officials at **St. Louis County** assume no fiscal impact from this proposal.

Oversight assumes streamlining the method of giving notice of hearings, whether published in print, digital format or on an official website, could result in a savings due to this proposal. Oversight assumes current budgets of cities and counties allow for publication costs and could result in an unknown fiscal savings should the city choose to change from print to giving notice on their website. Oversight will, therefore, reflect a \$0 to unknown direct fiscal savings for this proposal.

FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

FISCAL DESCRIPTION

This bill reduces from 15 to seven the number of days' notice that must be given before a public hearing on the establishment or amendment of a municipal zoning district or its boundaries. The bill also authorizes publication of the notice in the digital format of a qualifying newspaper or on the official website of the municipality. If notice is posted on the official website, the language of the regulation, restriction, or boundary must be posted in its entirety, too.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
