FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the Office of Administration, Commissioner's Office/Alternative to Abortions Program state this proposal has the potential to increase the number of informed consent booklets needed by abortion providers and family planning agencies. It is assumed that the Alternatives to Abortion program will continue to receive awareness funding at its current level. If funds are reduced or restricted in future years, the Alternatives to Abortion program may be unable to provide the Department of Health and Senior Services with funding assistance for the printing and shipping of the informed consent booklets. However, at the present time any additional costs could be absorbed by existing Alternatives to Abortion awareness funding.

Officials from the **Office of Attorney General** and the **Department of Health and Senior Services** each assume the proposal would not fiscally impact their respective agencies.

In response to similar legislation from the current session (SB 230), officials from **St. Louis County** assumed the proposal would not fiscally impact their agency.

Officials from **St. Louis City** and the counties of: **Jackson** and **St. Louis** did not respond to **Oversight's** request for a statement of fiscal impact.
