FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials at the **Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE)** assume to calculate the impact, all school districts in the state were listed from highest to lowest in regards to their assessed valuation per Weighted Average Daily Attendance (WADA) for the 2004-05 school year. The lowest 10% were then identified and 10% was added to their Basic Formula payment. The total additional cost to the state is \$21,184,003 per year.

As long as the formula is underfunded there would be no additional cost to the state. In this case the additional money is going to be shifted from all other school districts. If the formula is fully funded then it would be an additional cost to the state of \$21,184,003 per year.


FISCAL DESCRIPTION
