#### FISCAL ANALYSIS

#### **ASSUMPTION**

Officials at the **Office of the Secretary of State (SOS)** assume this proposal requires all voters to use a paper ballot that is hand marked. This would require election authorities that use direct-record electronic (DRE) voting machines to replace them with a paper ballot marking device that can accept paper ballots that are hand marked. It is estimated there are 4,193 direct-record voting machines currently in use.

The cost to replace a single voting machine is approximately \$5,000. SOS estimates between 75% and 100% will be replaced in the first year, for a cost range of \$15,725,000 to \$20,965,000. Each fiscal year thereafter, between 0% and 100% (0% to 25% of the original 4,193) of the remaining machines will be replaced, for a cost range of \$0 to \$5,240,000.

In addition, SOS states many bills considered by the General Assembly include provisions allowing or requiring agencies to submit rules and regulations to implement the act. The SOS is provided with core funding to handle a certain amount of normal activity resulting from each year's legislative session. The fiscal impact for this fiscal note to the SOS for Administrative Rules is less than \$2,500. The SOS recognizes that this is a small amount and does not expect that additional funding would be required to meet these costs. However, the SOS also recognizes that many such bills may be passed by the General Assembly in a given year and that collectively the costs may be in excess of what the office can sustain with the core budget. Therefore, the SOS reserves the right to request funding for the cost of supporting administrative rules requirements should the need arise based on a review of the finally approved bills signed by the governor.

**Oversight** assumes the SOS could absorb the costs of printing and distributing regulations related to this proposal. If multiple bills pass which require the printing and distribution of regulations at substantial costs, the SOS could request funding through the appropriation process.

Officials at the **St. Louis County Board of Election Commission** assume this proposal would require the use of paper ballots in future elections, and would restrict DRE usage to those with disabilities.

**Oversight** assumes this proposal will not fiscally impact the local election authorities as the state will reimburse the costs of the purchase of the new machines and printing expenses. Oversight will reflect reimbursement for the equipment replacement in FY 2018.

Officials from the **Jackson County Election Board**, **Platte County Board of Elections** and **Buchanan County** each assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations.

Officials at the following boards of election commission: Kansas City Board of Election Commission, St. Louis City Board of Election Commission and Clay County Board of Election Commission did not respond to **Oversight's** request for fiscal impact.

Officials at the following counties: Andrew, Atchison, Boone, Camden, Carroll, Christian, Clay, Cole, Cooper, Daviess, Franklin, Knox, Marion, Miller, Montgomery, New Madrid, Phelps, Platte, and Wayne did not respond to **Oversight's** request for fiscal impact.

## FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

## FISCAL DESCRIPTION

This proposal requires that electronic touch screen voting machines be phased out and replaced by paper ballot marking devices for the disabled. Machines that wear out or break or are subject to replacement for any reason after January 01, 2018, will be replaced by paper ballot marking devices.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
