FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials at the **Department of Elementary and Secondary Education** assume there is no fiscal impact from this proposal.

In response to the previous version, officials at the **Office of the Attorney General** assumed that any potential costs arising from this proposal can be absorbed with existing resources.

In response to the previous version, officials at the **Brentwood School District** assumed \$6,000 for staff training at each building.

Officials at the **Kansas City** and the **West Plains** school districts each assume there is no fiscal impact from this proposal.

In response to the previous version, officials at the **Bakersfield R-IV, Forsyth R-III, Kirksville R-III, Pettis County R-XII**, and the **Seymour R-II** school districts each assumed there was no fiscal impact from this proposal to their respective district.

Oversight notes this proposal allows a school district to teach students about the history of traditional winter and spring celebrations (such as Christmas, Hanukkah and Easter) and to display symbols of those celebrations on school property. Oversight notes this proposal is optional for the school districts. Oversight assumes this would not have a fiscal impact on the school districts.

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

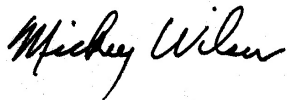
FISCAL DESCRIPTION
