FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Public Safety - State Emergency Management Agency** and the **MoDOT & Patrol Employee's Retirement System** each assume the proposal would not fiscally impact their respective agencies.

Officials from the **Department of Public Safety - Missouri Highway Patrol** believe the impact will be minimal and can be absorbed.

Officials from the **Springfield Police Department** state there could be a possible fiscal impact to their department and the City of Springfield if they choose to pay the retired officers, or the retired officer suffers an injury or line-of-duty death during the temporary employment.

Oversight assumes this proposal is permissive to local political subdivisions and their police departments or sheriff's departments regarding the temporary employment of retired peace officers. Therefore, Oversight will not reflect a potential impact from this proposal.

Officials from the Attorney General's Office, Boone County Sheriff's Office, Cole County Sheriff's Office, Columbia Police Department, Independence Police Department, Platte County Sheriff's Office, and the St. Louis Metropolitan Police Department did not respond to **Oversight's** request for fiscal impact.
