FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

In response to a previous version of the proposal, officials from the **Department of Public Safety - State Emergency Management Agency**, the **MoDOT & Patrol Employee's Retirement System**, and the **Attorney General's Office** each assumed the proposal would not fiscally impact their respective agencies.

Officials from the **Department of Public Safety - Missouri Highway Patrol** assume no fiscal impact from the proposal.

In response to a previous version of the proposal, officials from the **Springfield Police Department** stated there could be a possible fiscal impact to their department and the City of Springfield if they choose to pay the retired officers, or the retired officer suffers an injury or line-of-duty death during the temporary employment.

Oversight assumes this proposal is permissive to local political subdivisions and their police departments or sheriff's departments regarding the temporary use of retired peace officers. Also, the House Committee Substitute states that these retirees shall serve as volunteers. Therefore, Oversight will not reflect a potential impact from this proposal.

Officials from the Boone County Sheriff's Office, Cole County Sheriff's Office, Columbia Police Department, Independence Police Department, Platte County Sheriff's Office, and the St. Louis Metropolitan Police Department did not respond to **Oversight's** request for fiscal impact.
