

HB 332 -- PUBLIC HEALTH

Beginning August 28, 2018, the bill requires that shingles vaccines administered to patients in public health clinics in Missouri must be vaccines that produce the highest available immune response and that contain no foreign human DNA contaminants. The bill requires that chicken pox vaccines administered to patients in public health clinics must be vaccines that contain no foreign human DNA contaminants.

The bill requires the Missouri Autism and Developmental Disabilities Monitoring Project of the Center for Disease Control and Prevention to annually report on autistic and developmentally disabled children of four and eight years of age.
