Offered By 1 AMEND Senate Committee Substitute for Senate Bill No. 644, Page 1, Section A, Line 3, by 2 inserting after all of said line the following: 3 4 "447.541. 1. Within two hundred forty days from the due date of the report required by 5 section 447.539, the treasurer shall cause notice to be published at least once each week for two 6 successive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation as defined in section 493.050 in the county 7 in this state in which is located the last known address of any person to be named in the notice. If 8 no address is listed or if the address is outside this state and the property may be subject to sale or 9 liquidation, the notice shall be published in the county in which the holder of the abandoned property has his principal place of business within this state. 10 2. The published notice shall [be entitled "Notice of Names of Persons Appearing to be 11 12 Owners of Abandoned Property", and shall] contain[: (1) The names in alphabetical order and last known addresses, if any, of persons listed in the 13 14 report and entitled to notice within the county as specified in subsection 1 of this section; 15 (2)] a statement that information is available on the state treasurer website and a phone 16 number for the state treasurer [concerning the amount or description of the property and the name and address of the holder may be obtained by any persons possessing an interest in the property by 17 18 addressing an inquiry to the treasurer; 19 (3) A statement that if proof of claim is not presented by the owner to the holder and if the 20 owner's right to receive the property is not established to the treasurer's satisfaction within one year from the date of the delivery of the property to the treasurer, the abandoned property will be sold as 21 22 provided in section 447.558. The treasurer is not required to publish in the notice any items of less than fifty dollars unless, in the aggregate, the items total fifty or more dollars for any one individual. 23 24 The treasurer shall use reasonable diligence to determine if small items in fact belong to the same 25 individual]. 26 3. Within one hundred twenty days from the receipt of the report required by section 27 447.539, the treasurer shall mail a notice to each person having an address listed therein who appears to be entitled to property of the value of fifty dollars or more presumed abandoned under 28 29 sections 447.500 to 447.595. 30 4. The mailed notice shall contain: (1) A statement that, according to a report filed with the treasurer, property is being held by 31 32 the treasurer to which the addressee appears entitled; and 33 (2) A statement that, if satisfactory proof of claim is not presented by the owner to the 34 treasurer by the date specified in the published notice, the property will be sold as provided in 35 section 447.558. 36 5. Subsections 1 and 4 of this section are not applicable to sums payable on traveler's checks Action Taken Date

- 6. In addition to the above forms of notice to owners of abandoned property, the treasurer shall work with other state agencies to provide notice to holders of their rights and responsibilities pursuant to sections 447.500 to 447.595 by including information regarding Missouri's unclaimed property laws.
- 6 7. The provisions of subsections 1 and 2 of this section shall automatically terminate on
 7 December thirty-first fifteen years after the effective date of this act unless reauthorized by an act of
- 8 the general assembly."; and
