2 Senate Bill No. 826, Page 13, Section 195.265, Line 18, by inserting after all of said line the
3 following:

5 "326.319. 1. All moneys payable pursuant to the provisions of this chapter shall be
6 collected by the division of professional registration who shall transmit them to the department of
7 revenue for deposit in the state treasury to the credit of a fund to be known as the "State Board of
8 Accountancy Fund" which is hereby created.

9 2. Notwithstanding the provisions of section 33.080 to the contrary, money in the fund shall
10 not be transferred and placed to the credit of general revenue until the amount in the fund at the end
11 of the biennium exceeds two times the average amount of [the appropriation] expenses from the
12 board's funds for the preceding three completed fiscal [year or, if the board requires by rule
13 certificate or permit renewal less frequently than yearly, then three times the appropriation from the
14 board's funds for the preceding fiscal year] years. The amount, if any, in the fund which shall lapse
15 is that amount in the fund [which] that exceeds two times the [appropriate multiple of the
16 appropriations from the board's funds for the preceding fiscal year] amount of such three-year
17 average. However, no moneys in this fund shall be transferred and placed to the credit of general
18 revenue in fiscal year 2020.

19 3. In any proceeding in which a remedy provided by subsection 1 or 2 of section 326.310 is
20 imposed, the board may also require the respondent licensee to pay the costs of the proceeding if the
21 board is a prevailing party or in settlement. The moneys shall be placed in the state treasury to the
22 credit of the "Missouri State Board of Accountancy Investigation Fund", which is hereby created, to
23 be used solely for investigations as provided in this chapter. The moneys shall not be considered in
24 calculating amounts to be transferred to general revenue as provided in subsection 2 of this section.
25 The fund shall be used solely for board investigations.

26 4. The board shall set the amount of the fees which this chapter authorizes and requires by
27 rule pursuant to chapter 536. The fees shall be set at a level to produce revenue which shall not
28 substantially exceed the cost and expense of administering this chapter.

29 327.081. 1. All funds received pursuant to the provisions of this chapter shall be deposited
30 in the state treasury to the credit of the "State Board for Architects, Professional Engineers,
31 Professional Land Surveyors and Professional Landscape Architects Fund" which is hereby
32 established. All expenditures authorized by this chapter shall be paid from funds appropriated to the
33 board by the general assembly from this fund.

 23 professional registration and transmitted to the department of revenue for deposit in the state
 24 treasury to the credit of the fund to be known as the "Board of Embalmers and Funeral Directors'
 25 Fund".

26 2. All compensation of board members and employees and all expenses incident to the
 27 administration of this chapter shall be paid out of the board of embalmers and funeral directors'
 28 fund. No expense of this board shall ever be paid out of any other fund of the state, either by
 29 deficiency bill or otherwise.

40 334.050. 1. There is hereby established in the office of the state treasurer a fund to be
 41 known as the "Board of Registration for the Healing Arts Fund". All fees of any kind and character
 42 authorized to be charged by the board shall be collected by the director of the division of
 43 professional registration and shall be transmitted to the department of revenue for deposit in the
 44 state treasury for credit to this fund, to be disbursed only in payment of expenses of maintaining the
 45 board and for the enforcement of the provisions of law concerning professions regulated by the
 46 board; and no other money shall be paid out of the state treasury for carrying out these provisions.
 47 Warrants shall be issued on the state treasurer for payment out of said fund.

 11 for certificate of licensure to practice as physician and surgeon, an examination fee. Should the
 12 examination prove unsatisfactory and the board refuse to issue a license thereon, the applicant
 13 failing to pass the examination may return to any meeting and be examined upon payment of a
 14 reexamination fee.

15 335.036. 1. The board shall:

16 (1) Elect for a one-year term a president and a secretary, who shall also be treasurer, and the
 17 board may appoint, employ and fix the compensation of a legal counsel and such board personnel as
 18 defined in subdivision (4) of subsection 10 of section 324.001 as are necessary to administer the
 19 provisions of sections 335.011 to 335.096;

20 (2) Adopt and revise such rules and regulations as may be necessary to enable it to carry
 21 into effect the provisions of sections 335.011 to 335.096;

22 (3) Prescribe minimum standards for educational programs preparing persons for licensure
 23 pursuant to the provisions of sections 335.011 to 335.096;

24 (4) Provide for surveys of such programs every five years and in addition at such times as it
 25 may deem necessary;

26 (5) Designate as "approved" such programs as meet the requirements of sections 335.011 to
 27 335.096 and the rules and regulations enacted pursuant to such sections; and the board shall
 28 annually publish a list of such programs;

29 (6) Deny or withdraw approval from educational programs for failure to meet prescribed
 30 minimum standards;

31 (7) Examine, license, and cause to be renewed the licenses of duly qualified applicants;

32 (8) Cause the prosecution of all persons violating provisions of sections 335.011 to 335.096,
 33 and may incur such necessary expenses therefor;

34 (9) Keep a record of all the proceedings; and make an annual report to the governor and to
 35 the director of the department of insurance, financial institutions and professional registration;

36 (10) Establish an impaired nurse program.

37 2. The board shall set the amount of the fees which this chapter authorizes and requires by
 38 rules and regulations. The fees shall be set at a level to produce revenue which shall not
 39 substantially exceed the cost and expense of administering this chapter.

40 3. All fees received by the board pursuant to the provisions of sections 335.011 to 335.096

 10 authority delegated prior to August 28, 1999, is of no force and effect and repealed. Nothing in this
 11 section shall be interpreted to repeal or affect the validity of any rule filed or adopted prior to
 12 August 28, 1999, if it fully complied with all applicable provisions of law. This section and chapter
 13 536 are nonseverable and if any of the powers vested with the general assembly pursuant to chapter
 14 536 to review, to delay the effective date or to disapprove and annul a rule are subsequently held
 15 unconstitutional, then the grant of rulemaking authority and any rule proposed or adopted after
 16 August 28, 1999, shall be invalid and void."; and

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 21 "338.070. 1. The board of pharmacy shall set the amount of the fees which this chapter
 22 authorizes and requires by rules and regulations promulgated pursuant to chapter 536. The fees
 23 shall be set at a level to produce revenue which shall not substantially exceed the cost and expense
 24 of administering this chapter. All fees shall be paid before an applicant may be admitted to
 25 examination or his or her name placed upon the register of pharmacists, or before any license or
 26 permit, or any renewal thereof, is issued by the board.

27 2. All fees payable pursuant to the provisions of this chapter shall be collected by the
 28 division of professional registration and transmitted to the department of revenue for deposit in the
