1 AMEND House Bill No. 1832, Page 1, Section A, Line 3, by inserting after all of said line the following:

3 "407.300. 1. Every purchaser or collector of, or dealer in, junk, scrap metal, or any secondhand
4 property shall keep a register containing a written or electronic record for each purchase or trade in which
5 each type of ~~[metal]~~ material subject to the provisions of this section is obtained for value. There shall be a
6 separate record for each transaction involving any:

- 7 (1) Copper, brass, or bronze;
8 (2) Aluminum wire, cable, pipe, tubing, bar, ingot, rod, fitting, or fastener;
9 (3) Material containing copper or aluminum that is knowingly used for farming purposes as farming
10 is defined in section 350.010; whatever may be the condition or length of such metal; ~~[or]~~
11 (4) Catalytic converter; or
12 (5) Motor vehicle, heavy equipment, or tractor battery.

13 2. The record required by this section shall contain the following data:

- 14 (1) A copy of the driver's license or photo identification issued by the state or by the United States
15 government or agency thereof to the person from whom the material is obtained;
16 (2) The current address, gender, birth date, and a photograph of the person from whom the material
17 is obtained if not included or are different from the identification required in subdivision (1) of this
18 subsection;
19 (3) The date, time, and place of the transaction;
20 (4) The license plate number of the vehicle used by the seller during the transaction;
21 (5) A full description of the ~~[metal]~~ material, including the weight and purchase price.

22 3. The records required under this section shall be maintained for a minimum of twenty-four months
23 from when such material is obtained and shall be available for inspection by any law enforcement officer.

24 4. Anyone convicted of violating this section shall be guilty of a class B misdemeanor.

25 5. This section shall not apply to any of the following transactions:

- 26 (1) Any transaction for which the total amount paid for all regulated ~~[scrap metal]~~ material
27 purchased or sold does not exceed fifty dollars, unless the ~~[scrap metal]~~ material is a catalytic converter;
28 (2) Any transaction for which the seller, including a farm or farmer, has an existing business
29 relationship with the scrap metal dealer and is known to the scrap metal dealer making the purchase to be an
30 established business or political subdivision that operates a business with a fixed location that can be
31 reasonably expected to generate regulated scrap metal and can be reasonably identified as such a business; or
32 (3) Any transaction for which the type of metal subject to subsection 1 of this section is a minor part
33 of a larger item, except for equipment used in the generation and transmission of electrical power or
34 telecommunications. "; and

36 Further amend said bill by amending the title, enacting clause, and intersectional references accordingly.
