1 AMEND House Amendment No. \_\_\_\_\_ to House Committee Bill No. 23, Page 1, Line 1, by  
2 inserting after the phrase "No. 23," the following:

4 "Page 14, Section 82.505, Line 19, by inserting immediately after all of said section and line the  
5 following:

7 "84.510. 1. For the purpose of operation of the police department herein created, the chief  
8 of police, with the approval of the board, shall appoint such number of police department  
9 employees, including police officers and civilian employees as the chief of police from time to time  
10 deems necessary.

11 2. The base annual compensation of police officers shall be as follows for the several ranks:

12 (1) Lieutenant colonels, not to exceed five in number, at not less than seventy-one thousand  
13 nine hundred sixty-nine dollars, nor more than ~~one hundred thirty-three thousand eight hundred~~  
14 ~~eighty-eight~~ one hundred forty-six thousand one hundred twenty four dollars per annum each;

15 (2) Majors at not less than sixty-four thousand six hundred seventy-one dollars, nor more  
16 than ~~one hundred twenty-two thousand one hundred fifty-three~~ one hundred thirty-three thousand  
17 three hundred twenty dollars per annum each;

18 (3) Captains at not less than fifty-nine thousand five hundred thirty-nine dollars, nor more  
19 than ~~one hundred eleven thousand four hundred thirty-four~~ one hundred twenty-one thousand six  
20 hundred eight dollars per annum each;

21 (4) Sergeants at not less than forty-eight thousand six hundred fifty-nine dollars, nor more  
22 than ~~ninety-seven thousand eighty-six~~ one hundred six thousand five hundred sixty dollars per  
23 annum each;

24 (5) Master patrol officers at not less than fifty-six thousand three hundred four dollars, nor  
25 more than ~~eighty-seven thousand seven hundred one~~ ninety-four thousand three hundred thirty-two  
26 dollars per annum each;

27 (6) Master detectives at not less than fifty-six thousand three hundred four dollars, nor more  
28 than ~~eighty-seven thousand seven hundred one~~ ninety-four thousand three hundred thirty-two  
29 dollars per annum each;

30 (7) Detectives, investigators, and police officers at not less than twenty-six thousand six  
31 hundred forty-three dollars, nor more than ~~eighty-two thousand six hundred nineteen~~ eighty-seven  
32 thousand six hundred thirty-six dollars per annum each.

33 3. The board of police commissioners has the authority by resolution to effect a

1 comprehensive pay schedule program to provide for step increases with separate pay rates within  
2 each rank, in the above-specified salary ranges from police officers through chief of police.

3 4. Officers assigned to wear civilian clothes in the performance of their regular duties may  
4 receive an additional one hundred fifty dollars per month clothing allowance. Uniformed officers  
5 may receive seventy-five dollars per month uniform maintenance allowance.

6 5. The chief of police, subject to the approval of the board, shall establish the total regular  
7 working hours for all police department employees, and the board has the power, upon  
8 recommendation of the chief, to pay additional compensation for all hours of service rendered in  
9 excess of the established regular working period, but the rate of overtime compensation shall not  
10 exceed one and one-half times the regular hourly rate of pay to which each member shall normally  
11 be entitled. No credit shall be given nor deductions made from payments for overtime for the  
12 purpose of retirement benefits.

13 6. The board of police commissioners, by majority affirmative vote, including the mayor,  
14 has the authority by resolution to authorize incentive pay in addition to the base compensation as  
15 provided for in subsection 2 of this section, to be paid police officers of any rank who they  
16 determine are assigned duties which require an extraordinary degree of skill, technical knowledge  
17 and ability, or which are highly demanding or unusual. No credit shall be given nor deductions  
18 made from these payments for the purpose of retirement benefits.

19 7. The board of police commissioners may effect programs to provide additional  
20 compensation for successful completion of academic work at an accredited college or university.  
21 No credit shall be given nor deductions made from these payments for the purpose of retirement  
22 benefits.

23 8. The additional pay increments provided in subsections 6 and 7 of this section shall not be  
24 considered a part of the base compensation of police officers of any rank and shall not exceed ten  
25 percent of what the officer would otherwise be entitled to pursuant to subsections 2 and 3 of this  
26 section.

27 9. Not more than twenty-five percent of the officers in any rank who are receiving the  
28 maximum rate of pay authorized by subsections 2 and 3 of this section may receive the additional  
29 pay increments authorized by subsections 6 and 7 of this section at any given time. However, any  
30 officer receiving a pay increment provided pursuant to the provisions of subsections 6 and 7 of this  
31 section shall not be deprived of such pay increment as a result of the limitations of this subsection.";
