Known as the Battles of Lexington and Concord, the battles marked the outbreak of open armed conflict between the Kingdom of Great Britain and thirteen of its colonies on the mainland of British America to establish American independence; and
6 7 8	<b>WHEREAS</b> , the first Militia units, which became today's National Guard, were established in the Massachusetts Bay Colonies on December 13, 1636, and armed to protect American citizens; and
9 10 11 12	<b>WHEREAS</b> , between 1775 and 2017, over 41 million Americans have served in the Armed Forces of the United States, in addition to countless Militiamen between 1636 and 1775; and
13 14 15 16	<b>WHEREAS</b> , the United States has suffered casualties of over 1.4 million men and women, including scores of Missouri citizens who have made the ultimate sacrifice to defend democracy and freedom; and
18 19 20	<b>WHEREAS</b> , the families who have lost immediate relatives in support of military operations are known as Gold Star Families; and
21 22 23 24	WHEREAS, the people of Missouri wish to properly honor our military men and women who gave their lives in service to our country and thank their families for their sacrifice and bravery, recognizing that no one has given more for this nation than the families of the fallen; and

29 30 31	WHEREAS, the purpose of the Gold Star Families Memorial Monument is to honor Gold Star families who have sacrificed and lost loved ones in service to their country, and who stand as a stark reminder that freedom is not free; and

33 34 35 36	WHEREAS, it is appropriate to honor the fallen warriors from the state of Missouri, and their families, by recognizing the Gold Star Families Memorial Monument, which has been constructed and dedicated on the College of the Ozarks campus, as the official Gold Star Families Memorial Monument of the state of Missouri:
