1 **WHEREAS**, the United States Congress has recently enacted an electronic logging
2 device mandate for trucks and specified commercial vehicles and its enforcement as a final rule
3 is likely to cost two billion dollars or more; and

5 **WHEREAS**, this final rule is burdensome to free market commerce among the states;
6 and

8 **WHEREAS**, the electronic monitoring requirement is an invasion of privacy mandated
9 by the federal government; and

11 **WHEREAS**, the final rule greatly increases the final cost of consumer goods to the
12 American people; and

13

14 **WHEREAS**, the final rule will inhibit economic activity and reduce job growth as well
15 as inhibit economically efficient transactions nationwide; and

17 **WHEREAS**, the final rule is an Obama Administration imposition of corporate welfare
18 that has the pernicious effect of benefitting politically powerful large corporations at the expense
19 of small business; and

21 **WHEREAS**, the Secretary of Transportation has the authority to waive the final rule or
22 exempt all Americans from its enforcement under 49 U.S.C. Section 31133(a)(10):

24 **NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** that we, the members of the Missouri House
25 of Representatives, Ninety-ninth General Assembly, Second Regular Session, hereby urge the
26 Secretary of Transportation to immediately suspend the final rule for all persons and companies
27 nationwide; and

29 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that we hereby urge the United States Congress to
30 repeal any enabling authority for the final rule such that the final rule is void; and

32 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Chief Clerk of the Missouri House of
33 Representatives be instructed to prepare a properly inscribed copy of this resolution for the
34 Speaker of the United States House of Representatives, the President Pro Tempore of the United
35 States Senate, and to each member of Missouri's congressional delegation.
