FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Health and Senior Services (DHSS)** assume the proposal would have no fiscal impact on their organization.

Oversight notes that from conversations with DHSS officials the department states they already have a surplus of the printed materials required by this proposal stored in their warehouse. In addition, DHSS states that the required materials are posted on their website and can be printed by clinics/providers when necessary. It is further assumed by DHSS officials that if someone needed the required materials to be sent to them, the clinic/provider would bear the mailing costs. Therefore, this proposal is not expected to have a fiscal impact on the DHSS.

Oversight notes that the **Office of Attorney General**, the **Department of Social Services**, the **Office of State Courts Administrator** and **St. Louis County** have each stated the proposal would not have a direct fiscal impact on their respective organizations. Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note for these organizations.

Oversight only reflects the responses that we have received from state agencies and political subdivisions; however, the **City of St. Louis** and **Jackson County** were requested to respond to this proposed legislation but did not.
