

HB 1033 -- SEXUAL OFFENDERS

This bill repeals language requiring individuals who have been required to register under tribal, federal, or military law to register on the Sexual Offender Registry in Missouri. The bill also repeals language allowing the registration period to be reduced by successfully completing any periods of supervised release, probation, or parole. The bill specifies that individuals shall be required to register for certain offenses, specified in statute, or for offenses that have the same elements as those specified in statute.

The bill also repeals language that requires individuals who are required to register in this state because of an offense that was adjudicated in another jurisdiction to file a petition for removal from the registry according to the laws of the jurisdiction where the offense was adjudicated. Instead, such individuals are required to file the petition in the Division of the Circuit Court where the offender resides and registers.
