1 AMEND House Joint Resolution No. 72, Page 3, Section 1, Line 60, by inserting after all of said
2 line the following:

4 "(12) "Out-of-state medical marijuana patient license", an unexpired medical marijuana patient
5 license issued by another state that is substantially similar to the qualifying patient and primary
6 caregiver identification cards issued under this section;"; and

8 Further amend said bill and section by numbering subsequent subdivisions accordingly;

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10 Further amend said bill and section, Page 11, Line 362, by inserting after all of said line the
11 following:

13 "(21) Persons who hold a current out-of-state medical marijuana patient license may apply for a
14 temporary qualifying patient or primary caregiver identification card in this state. Such temporary
15 identification card, which shall be valid for a period of thirty days, shall entitle the holder of the card
16 to possess and purchase marijuana in this state subject to the limitations applicable to holders of
17 standard qualifying patient and primary caregiver identification cards issued under this section. The
18 provisions of this section and any laws, rules, or regulations applicable to persons holding standard
19 qualifying patient or primary caregiver identification cards issued under this section shall apply to
20 persons issued temporary identification cards under this section. Applicants for temporary
21 qualifying patient or primary caregiver identification cards shall present to the department the
22 following:

23 (a) A color copy or digital image file of the front and back of the applicant's unexpired out-
24 of-state medical marijuana patient license; and

25 (b) A color copy or digital image file of one of the following documents:

26 (i) Front and back of a valid state-issued driver's license or identification card;

27 (ii) A United States passport or other photo identification issued by the United States
28 government; or

29 (iii) A certified copy of the applicant's birth certificate.

31 The department shall charge a fee of twenty dollars for a temporary identification card issued under
32 this section, with such fee to be increased or decreased each year by the percentage of increase or
33 decrease from the end of the previous calendar year of the Consumer Price Index, or successor index
34 as published by the U.S. Department of Labor, or its successor agency. Upon receiving an
35 application for a temporary qualifying patient or primary caregiver identification card, the
36 department shall, within thirty days, either issue the temporary card or provide a written explanation

6 accordingly.
