FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

The **Department of Elementary and Secondary Education** assumes this proposal has no direct fiscal impact on their agency.

In response to a similar proposal, HB 343 (2019), officials from the **Springfield Public Schools, Francis Howell School District** and **Wellsville-Middletown R-1 School District** assumed that proposal would have no fiscal impact on their organizations.

Oversight notes this proposal allows students attending a public schools to possess and apply sun-screen while on school property or at any school-related event or activity. Oversight notes the responding school districts stated the proposal would not have a direct fiscal impact on their organizations. Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight assumes there is no fiscal impact resulting from this proposal.

Oversight only reflects the responses that we have received from state agencies and political subdivisions; however, other school districts were requested to respond to this proposed legislation but did not. A general listing of political subdivisions included in our database is available upon request.
