AN ACT

To amend chapter 167, RSMo, by adding thereto two new sections relating to health professionals in public schools.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 167, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto two new sections, to be known as sections 167.501 and 167.503, to read as follows:

167.501. 1. Subject to appropriation, any public school shall be eligible for a state financial supplement to employ a school nurse who is licensed under chapter 335 as provided in this section.

2. Any school district may apply to the department of elementary and secondary education for a state financial supplement to employ a school nurse in each school named in the application and in no other schools of the district. The state financial supplement shall not exceed forty thousand dollars per school nurse. No more than one school nurse per school shall be supplemented by the state under this section.

3. (1) There is hereby created in the state treasury the "School Nurse Financial Supplement Fund", which shall consist of any grants, gifts, donations, bequests, or moneys appropriated under this section. The state treasurer shall be custodian of the fund. In accordance with sections 30.170 and 30.180, the state treasurer may approve disbursements. The fund shall be a dedicated fund and, upon appropriation, moneys in the fund shall be used solely as provided in this section.

EXPLANATION — Matter enclosed in bold-faced brackets [thus] in the above bill is not enacted and is intended to be omitted from the law. Matter in **bold-face** type in the above bill is proposed language.

15 (2) Notwithstanding the provisions of section 33.080 to the contrary, any moneys
16 remaining in the fund at the end of the biennium shall not revert to the credit of the
17 general revenue fund.

18 (3) The state treasurer shall invest moneys in the fund in the same manner as other
19 funds are invested. Any interest and moneys earned on such investments shall be credited
20 to the fund.

21 4. (1) The department of elementary and secondary education shall promulgate
22 rules and regulations for the implementation of this section. Such rules shall include, but
23 not be limited to, ensuring that school nurses supplemented by the state under this section
24 primarily perform duties associated with student health, establishing application
25 procedures for school districts, and determining a method of awarding state financial
26 supplements in the event that the number of applications exceeds the amounts
27 appropriated for such awards. The department may give preference to schools that
28 demonstrate the greatest need for a school nurse under this section.

29 (2) Any rule or portion of a rule, as that term is defined in section 536.010, that is
30 created under the authority delegated in this section shall become effective only if it
31 complies with and is subject to all of the provisions of chapter 536 and, if applicable,
32 section 536.028. This section and chapter 536 are nonseverable, and if any of the powers
33 vested with the general assembly pursuant to chapter 536 to review, to delay the effective
34 date, or to disapprove and annul a rule are subsequently held unconstitutional, then the
35 grant of rulemaking authority and any rule proposed or adopted after the effective date
36 of this section shall be invalid and void.

 167.503. 1. Subject to appropriation, any public school shall be eligible for a state
2 financial supplement to employ a mental health professional who is licensed under chapter
3 337 as provided in this section.

4 2. Any school district may apply to the department of elementary and secondary
5 education for a state financial supplement to employ a mental health professional in each
6 school named in the application and in no other schools of the district. The state financial
7 supplement shall not exceed forty thousand dollars per mental health professional. No
8 more than one mental health professional per school shall be supplemented by the state
9 under this section.

10 3. (1) There is hereby created in the state treasury the "School Mental Health
11 Professional Financial Supplement Fund", which shall consist of any grants, gifts,
12 donations, bequests, or moneys appropriated under this section. The state treasurer shall
13 be custodian of the fund. In accordance with sections 30.170 and 30.180, the state

14 treasurer may approve disbursements. The fund shall be a dedicated fund and, upon
15 appropriation, moneys in the fund shall be used solely as provided in this section.

16 (2) Notwithstanding the provisions of section 33.080 to the contrary, any moneys
17 remaining in the fund at the end of the biennium shall not revert to the credit of the
18 general revenue fund.

19 (3) The state treasurer shall invest moneys in the fund in the same manner as other
20 funds are invested. Any interest and moneys earned on such investments shall be credited
21 to the fund.

22 4. (1) The department of elementary and secondary education shall promulgate
23 rules and regulations for the implementation of this section. Such rules shall include, but
24 not be limited to, ensuring that mental health professionals supplemented by the state
25 under this section primarily perform duties associated with student mental health,
26 establishing application procedures for school districts, and determining a method of
27 awarding state financial supplements in the event that the number of applications exceeds
28 the amounts appropriated for such awards. The department may give preference to
29 schools that demonstrate the greatest need for a mental health professional under this
30 section.

31 (2) Any rule or portion of a rule, as that term is defined in section 536.010, that is
32 created under the authority delegated in this section shall become effective only if it
33 complies with and is subject to all of the provisions of chapter 536 and, if applicable,
34 section 536.028. This section and chapter 536 are nonseverable, and if any of the powers
35 vested with the general assembly pursuant to chapter 536 to review, to delay the effective
36 date, or to disapprove and annul a rule are subsequently held unconstitutional, then the
37 grant of rulemaking authority and any rule proposed or adopted after the effective date
38 of this section shall be invalid and void.

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
