10	(1) "Law enforcement agency", the same meaning as defined in section 590.1040;
11	(2) "Peace officer", the same meaning as defined in section 590.010;
12	(3) "Use-of-force incident", an incident in which:
13	(a) A fatality occurs that is connected to a use of force by a peace officer;
14	(b) Serious bodily injury occurs that is connected to a use of force by a peace officer; or
15	(c) In the absence of death or serious bodily injury, a peace officer discharges a firearm at,
16	or in the direction of, a person.
17	3. Each law enforcement agency shall, at least annually, collect and report local data on use-
18	of-force incidents involving peace officers to the National Use of Force Data Collection through the
19	Law Enforcement Enterprise Portal administered by the Federal Bureau of Investigation.
20	4. Each law enforcement agency shall additionally report the data submitted under
21	subsection 3 of this section to the attorney general. Law enforcement agencies shall not include
22	personally identifying information of individual peace officers in their reports.
23	5. The attorney general shall, no later than June 30, 2022, develop standards and procedures
24	governing the collection and reporting of use-of-force data under this section. The standards and
25	procedures shall be consistent with the requirements, definitions, and methods of the National Use
26	of Force Data Collection administered by the Federal Bureau of Investigation.
27	6. The attorney general shall publish the data reported by law enforcement agencies under
28	subsection 4 of this section, including statewide aggregate data and agency-specific data, in a
29	publicly available report. Such data shall be deemed a public record consistent with the provisions
