AN ACT

To amend chapter 191, RSMo, by adding thereto one new section relating to natural immunity, with penalty provisions and an emergency clause.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the state of Missouri, as follows:

Section A. Chapter 191, RSMo, is amended by adding thereto one new section, to be
2 known as section 191.718, to read as follows:

191.718. 1. For purposes of this section, the following terms mean:

2 **(1) "Natural immunity", immunity acquired from exposure to a virus through
3 infection with the actual virus;**

4 **(2) "Political subdivision", any municipality, school district, special district,
5 local governmental body, county, city, town, or village;**

6 **(3) "Public entity":**

7 **(a) Any agency or instrumentality of the state government; or**

8 **(b) Any political subdivision or agency or instrumentality thereof;**

9 **(4) "Vaccination policy", any policy that considers whether an individual has
10 vaccine-induced immunity to determine the individual's:**

11 **(a) Access to any services, goods, facilities, advantages, privileges, licensing,
12 educational opportunities, or employment opportunities; or**

13 **(b) Treatment or status with respect to any benefits, services, or opportunities;**

14 **(5) "Vaccine-induced immunity", immunity acquired through vaccination
15 against a virus.**

16 **2. All public entities and private entities shall consider natural immunity
17 equivalent to vaccine-induced immunity for the purpose of implementing any**

18 vaccination policy. A statement from a licensed physician indicating that an individual
19 has documentation of a viral disease or laboratory evidence of immunity to a viral
20 disease shall be sufficient to demonstrate the individual has natural immunity to that
21 viral disease.

22 3. A violation of this section shall be a class A misdemeanor.

Section B. Because immediate action is necessary to ensure that individuals with natural immunity have access to the benefits available to individuals with vaccine-induced immunity, the enactment of section 191.718 of section A of this act is deemed necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, welfare, peace, and safety, and is hereby declared to be an emergency act within the meaning of the constitution, and the enactment of section 191.718 of section A of this act shall be in full force and effect upon its passage and approval.
