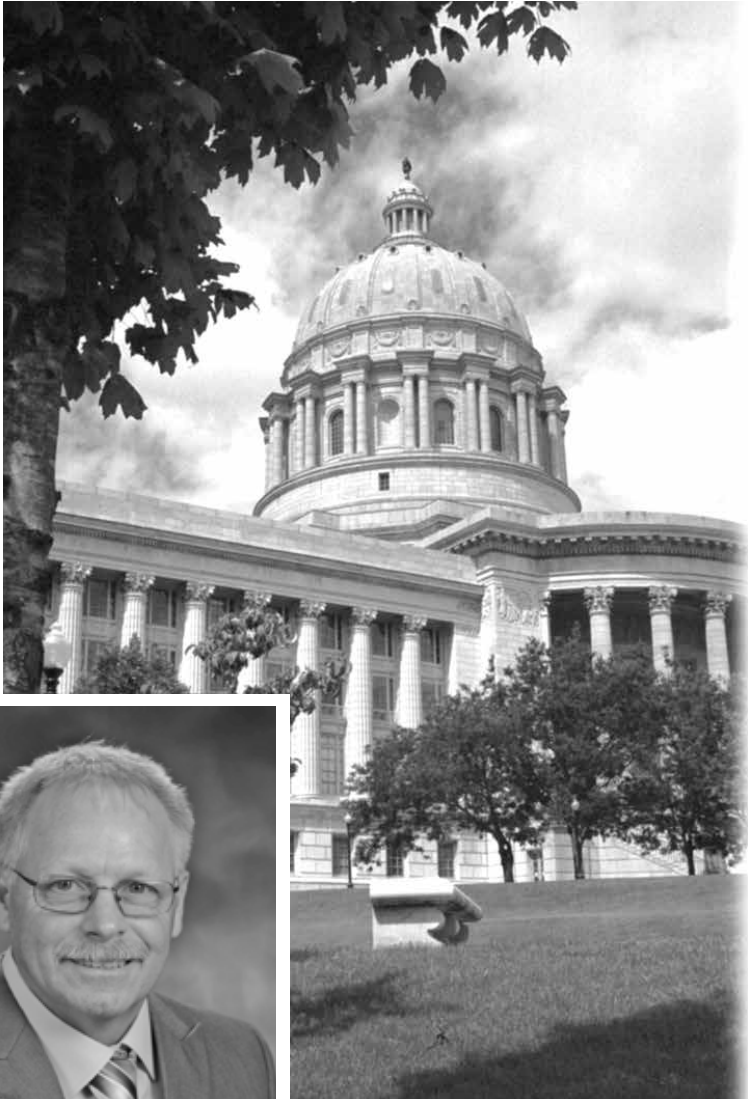

BILLS TRULY AGREED TO AND FINALLY PASSED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY THIS SESSION

- 1246** Requires the Department of Public Safety to develop human trafficking hotline posters
- 1250** Establishes the Missouri Fiduciary Access to Digital Assets Act, which allows fiduciaries to access electronic records of the account holder
- 1252** Changes the law regarding low-dose mammography screening
- 1268** Allows the Missouri Dental Board to issue dental faculty permits to individuals who are employed by accredited dental schools, colleges, or programs in Missouri
- 1286** Modifies provisions of law relating to the detonation of explosives and actions for private nuisances brought against certain permittees
- 1288** Extends the sunset for the Champion for Children Tax Credit and modifies provisions of a tax credit for donations to maternity homes
- 1291** Revises the definition of counties exempt from certain requirements of the county special road and bridge tax
- 1350** Modifies provisions relating to criminal history records
- 1355** Allows retired police officers to return to work when a disaster or emergency has been proclaimed by the governor or there is a national disaster
- 1364** Modifies provisions relating to hazardous waste fees paid to the Missouri Emergency Response Commission
- 1388** Modifies provisions relating to certain sports contests
- 1413** Requires authorization for certain labor unions to use dues and fees to make political contributions and requires consent for withholding earnings from paychecks
- 1415** Allows teachers to count hours spent in externships with local businesses as professional development hours
- 1428** Allows the county commission of noncharter counties to appoint persons to vacated county elected offices
- 1446** Modifies provisions relating to nonelection successions in certain political subdivisions
- 1456** Changes the laws regarding 911 emergency communication services
- 1460** Authorizes a tax deduction for any prize or award won by an Olympic medalist
- 1461** Modifies provisions relating to the Address Confidentiality Program
- 1465** Modifies various provisions relating to degree offerings at public institutions of higher education
- 1469** Modifies provisions of the Missouri military code by changing the name of the "Missouri Reserve Military Force" to the "Missouri State Defense Force"
- 1484** Changes the laws regarding the requirements for the operation of a bingo game
- 1492** Changes the law regarding the Show-Me Heroes program
- 1500** Modifies provisions relating to the practice of cosmetology and barbering
- 1503** Establishes a fund for providing state-guaranteed small business loans to veterans
- 1504** Requires certain counties to adopt ordinances regulating land use around National Guard training centers
- 1516** Specifies that licensed chiropractic physicians may treat and be reimbursed for conditions currently reimbursed under MO HealthNet
- 1517** Requires the Attorney General and the Commissioner of Administration to submit to the General Assembly a monthly report of all settlements and judgments paid from the state legal expense fund
- 1531** Modifies provisions relating to civil proceedings

- 1558** Creates the offense of nonconsensual dissemination of private sexual images
- 1606** Modifies provisions relating to elementary and secondary education

- 1729** Repeals provisions relating to prevailing wages on public works
- 1744** Modifies the A+ Schools Program by removing the requirement that a student's attendance of public high school occur in the three years immediately prior to graduation
- 1769** Establishes the offense of filing false documents
- 1796** Establishes the First-Time Home Buyer Savings Account Act and authorizes a tax deduction for contributions to a savings account dedicated to buying a first home
- 1797** Establishes the Nuclear Power Plant Security Guard Act
- 1809** Changes the laws regarding the Bi-state Metropolitan Development District compact by adding Franklin County
- 1831** Changes the laws regarding the sales tax holiday that occurs in early August by adding an exemption for disposable diapers
- 1832** Changes merchandising practices and credit user protection law and creates the offenses of defacing a credit card reader and illegal use of a card scanner
- 1838** Authorizes the conveyance of certain state property
- 1858** Requires the Department of Revenue to feature a map of all special taxing districts on its website
- 1872** Establishes a grant program for the installation of broadband internet service
- 1879** Changes the laws regarding financial transactions by public entities
- 1880** Declares the intent of the General Assembly to facilitate and encourage the development of fiber optic infrastructure by rural electric cooperatives
- 1887** Prohibits a property owners' association from preventing a property owner from placing political signs on his or her property
- 1953** Requires the Department of Health and Senior Services to develop and disseminate information regarding the bone marrow registry
- 1991** Modifies provisions relating to wireless facilities and related infrastructure
