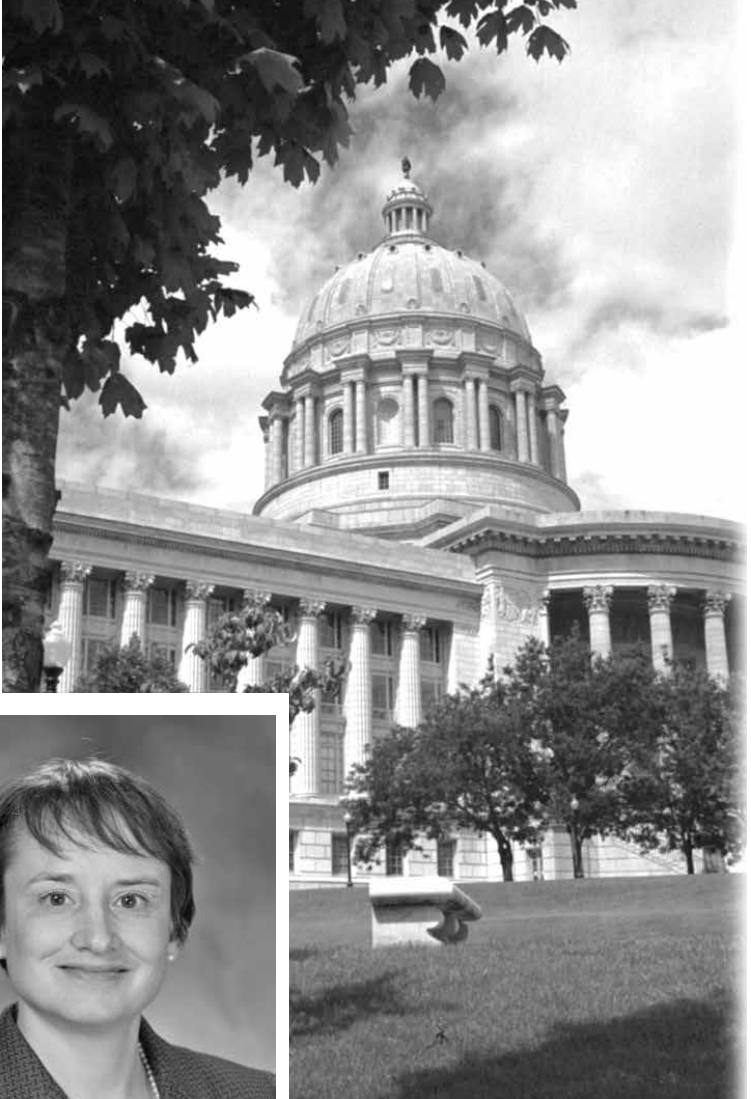

BILLS TRULY AGREED TO AND FINALLY PASSED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY THIS SESSION.

- 1246** Requires the Department of Public Safety to develop human trafficking hotline posters
- 1250** Establishes the Missouri Fiduciary Access to Digital Assets Act, which allows fiduciaries to access electronic records of the account holder
- 1252** Changes the law regarding low-dose mammography screening
- 1268** Allows the Missouri Dental Board to issue dental faculty permits to individuals who are employed by accredited dental schools, colleges, or programs in Missouri
- 1286** Modifies provisions of law relating to the detonation of explosives and actions for private nuisances brought against certain permittees
- 1288** Extends the sunset for the Champion for Children Tax Credit and modifies provisions of a tax credit for donations to maternity homes
- 1291** Revises the definition of counties exempt from certain requirements of the county special road and bridge tax
- 1350** Modifies provisions relating to criminal history records
- 1355** Allows retired police officers to return to work when a disaster or emergency has been proclaimed by the governor or there is a national disaster
- 1364** Modifies provisions relating to hazardous waste fees paid to the Missouri Emergency Response Commission
- 1388** Modifies provisions relating to certain sports contests
- 1413** Requires authorization for certain labor unions to use dues and fees to make political contributions and requires consent for withholding earnings from paychecks
- 1415** Allows teachers to count hours spent in externships with local businesses as professional development hours
- 1428** Allows the county commission of noncharter counties to appoint persons to vacated county elected offices
- 1446** Modifies provisions relating to nonelection successions in certain political subdivisions
- 1456** Changes the laws regarding 911 emergency communication services

- 1831 Changes the laws regarding the sales tax holiday that occurs in early August by adding an exemption for disposable diapers
- 1832 Changes merchandising practices and credit user protection law and creates the offenses of defacing a credit card reader and illegal use of a card scanner
- 1838 Authorizes the conveyance of certain state property
- 1858 Requires the Department of Revenue to feature a map of all special taxing districts on its website
- 1872 Establishes a grant program for the installation of broadband internet service
- 1879 Changes the laws regarding financial transactions by public entities
- 1880 Declares the Intent of the General Assembly to facilitate and encourage the development of fiber optic infrastructure by rural electric cooperatives
