2020 ELECTION INFORMATION



The November 3rd General Election is quickly approaching! Missouri's absentee ballot process is a bit complicated this year. Hopefully, the information in this newsletter will answer any questions you have and if not, please contact my office at (573) 751-2565. Please stay safe and exercise your right to vote.

IMPORTANT Deadlines for November Election

- September 22:** In-person absentee voting **STARTS** at the Christian County Clerk Office.
- September 25:** **FIRST WAVE** of absentee ballots mailed.
- October 7:** **LAST DAY** to register to vote. Register at the Christian County Clerk Office, MOVote.org, or www.sos.mo.gov/elections/govotemissouri/register.
- October 21:** **LAST DAY** to request an absentee ballot. Requests must be received by 5 p.m.
- November 2:** **LAST DAY** to vote early in-person absentee at Christian County Clerk Office.
- November 3:** **ELECTION DAY** Polls open from 6 a.m. to 7 p.m., if you are in line by 7 p.m. you can vote.

Absentee Voting

From today through 5 p.m. on October 21st, you may request an absentee ballot by:

- Calling the Christian County Clerk Office at 417-582-4340;
- In person at 100 W. Church St, Room 304, Ozark, 65721.
- Completing the online request through the Christian County Clerk Office website: www.christiancountymo.gov.



Absentee Voting Tips

- Request ballot ASAP and VOTE as soon as you receive your ballot.
- Turn envelope over, read all instructions carefully and use a first class stamp.
- No notary needed if you are over 65 or you select Option 2 or 7: (incapacity or confinement due to illness or disability or a caregiver) or at risk of contracting or transmitting Covid-19.
- ALL OTHER BALLOTS MUST BE NOTARIZED.
- Mail ballot by Oct. 24th to guarantee delivery or drop off ballot at the election.
- Keep the tear off from your ballot so you can track it on the Christian County Clerk Office
- If your ballot does not arrive at the election board before Election Day, you may go to the polls, inform the county clerk/sign the lost affidavit and vote.

If your absentee ballot is not received by the Christian County Clerk Office by 7 p.m. on Election Day, YOUR VOTE WILL NOT BE COUNTED.

If you are concerned about not receiving your absentee ballot, you may call the Christian County Clerk Office and check on the status of your request. The ballots may take up to 19 days to receive in

Mail-In Voting

If you requested a mail-in ballot, you must have it notarized and it must be mailed in the envelope provided. These should be mailed no later than October 21st.
