
THIS WEEK IN THE MISSOURI HOUSE



FLOOR ACTIONS

- On Tuesday, the House adopted **HR 39**, which calls on the Attorney General to file an independent lawsuit or join 20 state attorneys general in their lawsuit challenging the constitutionality of the federal health care reform legislation. The resolution passed by a vote of 115-46.
- On Thursday, the House adopted **HR 38**, which is the Rules of the House of Representatives for the 96th General Assembly. The resolution passed by a vote of 157-0.
- Some of the key rule changes include reducing paper use by distributing amendments on the House floor electronically, giving additional power to the minority party to appoint members to standing committees of the House, and placing a ban on smoking in the East Gallery of the House Chamber.

FAST FACTS

- 38 people have been inducted into the Hall of Famous Missourians.
- Gov. Warren Hearnes is the most recent inductee to the Hall. Gov. Hearnes was added Sept. 15, 2010.
- Samuel Clemens (Mark Twain) was the first person to be inducted into the Hall on September 8, 1982.
- 2006 saw the highest number of inductees including Jack Buck, John Ashcroft, Dale Carnegie and Rose Phillippine Duchesne.
- While the busts of Walt Disney and Gen. John J. Pershing reside approximately 20 ft. from one another on the 3rd floor of the capitol, their boyhood homes of Laclede and Marceline are 16.3 miles apart.

COMMITTEE ACTIONS

- On Wednesday, the House General Laws Committe voted do pass HB 73, which would require certain recipients of Temporary Assistance for Needy Families Program benefits to be tested for the illegal use of controlled substances.
- On Wednesday, The House Small Business Committee voted do pass HR 45, which would change the laws regarding the "Big Government Get Off My Back Act" and provides an income tax deduction for certain small businesses that create new full-time jobs.
