## Committee Vpdates...

- The Health Care Policy Committee heard a bill (HB 1625) that would provide pharmacies with liability immunity for refusing to participate in any act or in connection with any drug or device that causes a pregnancy to end prematurely resulting in an abortion. (2.12.08)
- The Special Committee on Veterans passed HB 1678, which would create the Interstate Compact on Educational Opportunity for Military Children, seeking to remove barriers on children in military families who move often. (2.12.08)
- The Election Committee considered two proposed constitutional amendments (HJR 45 and HJR 46) that would reduce the size of the Missouri House of Representatives. (2.12.08)
- Special Committee on Tourism passed a bill (HB 1824) that would designate the ice cream cone as the official state dessert. (2.13.08)

## Floor Action...

The following bill was third read and passed:

 HB 1661 - reinstates a tax break that allows Kansans working in Missouri to deduct their Kansas property taxes from their Missouri income taxes. (2.12.08)

#### The following bill was debated:

HJR 55 - proposes a constitutional amendment guaranteeing a citizen's First
 Amendment right to pray on public property and reaffirming a citizen's right to choose any or no religion. (2.14.08)

## More Committee Updates...

- The Committee on Crime Prevention and Public Safety
  passed HB 1619, which would establish the Drug Monitoring
  Act in the Dept. of Health and Senior Services and change
  laws regarding drugs and controlled substances. (2.13.08)
- The Committee on Elementary and Secondary Education heard a bill (HB 1722) that would change the laws regarding school employee liability, safety practices, and reporting acts of violence. (2.13.08)
