### Floor Action...

# The following bills were perfected:

 HBs 1595/1668 - Authorize an income tax credit for part of the cost of the construction of a storm shelter. (2.25.08)

# The following bills were third read and passed:

- HB 1314 Amy Hestir Davis Student Protection Act, aimed at protecting Missouri students from teacher misconduct. (2.28.08)
- HB 1970 Prohibits a person from initiating a civil action against any licensed motor vehicle dealer with whom the person did not directly and personally negotiate or communicate. (2.28.08)
- HB 1763 Changes the laws regarding petition circulators, including prohibiting the pay-

ment of circulators on a persignature basis and prohibiting circulators from soliciting signatures for two or more petitions simultaneously. (2.28.08)

# The following consent bills were third read and passed:

- HB 1774 Changes the maximum percentage of increase in annual compensation in the final average salary for members of the Public School Retirement System of Missouri. (2.25.08)
- HB 1310 Requires independent candidates to file declarations of candidacy and petitions for nomination by the same deadlines established for other candidates. (2.25.08)
- HB 1406 Establishes David's Law which requires MoDOT to establish and administer a drunk driving memorial sign program. (2.25.08)

# Committee Updates...

- Special Committee on Veterans passed HB 1788,
   which would authorize an income tax deduction from a taxpayer's adjusted gross income for 100% of military retirement income, regardless of age or income. (2.26.08)
- Transportation Committee
  heard HJR 67, which proposes
  a constitutional amendment
  distributing 10% of general
  revenue growth to the State
  Road Fund and the State
  Transportation Fund. (2.26.08)
- Higher Education Committee heard HB 1912, which specifies that if Missouri loses a Congressional district following the 2010 redistricting, the ninth member of the University of Missouri Board of Curators will be a student curator with voting rights. (2.26.08)
